
As a Friend, you can volunteer your time, support us financially or just keep in touch to help us spread the word about Citizens Advice.

Citizens Advice Westminster provides free, independent, confidential and impartial advice and information to local residents, some of whom are the most vulnerable in society. We value diversity, promote equality and challenge discrimination.

We work to:

- provide the advice people need for the problems they face and ensure individuals do not suffer from a lack of knowledge about their rights and responsibilities;
- improve the policies and practices that affect people's lives by influencing the responsible development of social policies and services.

In the last year, we have helped **5,731 clients** with **24,910 issues**. As a result of our assistance, clients realised **£2.43 million** in financial gains related to benefits, which is particularly important during the current cost-of-living crisis.

We also influence change and social policy for the good of the whole community by gathering evidence and identifying trends in the problems and issues clients experience.

We are then able to present this anonymised evidence to policy and decision-makers to highlight the negative impact services or practices have on our residents in order to drive improvements.
